


— MISSION STATEMENT —


The Spanish Peaks Community Foundation strategically directs the generous contributions of our members to meet the needs and support the quality of life of those living and working in the Big Sky community.





April 1st is the deadline for May 1st grant consideration.

October 1st deadline for November 1st grant consideration.

SPCF prioritizes programs that make the greatest community impact, multiple funding sources, and sustainable budgets.

Generally speaking, SPCF does not fund salaries, capital investment projects, events, and/or operational expenses.

— WHAT MAKES A STRONG GRANT REQUEST FOR SPCF FUNDING? —

THE SPCF BOARD SAYS:

- A grant that helps solve a problem for the people living and working in Big Sky.
- Clarity of impact to the BS community how will the program work and who will it serve
 - Alignment with our mission statement, articulate and compelling
 - Demonstrates a strong need for funding that can not be found elsewhere that will provide a direct benefit to underserved members of the community
 - Local Impact, proven need, clearly defined
 - single biggest impact of the funding
 - it's all about the scope of the impact vs. trying to address worthwhile projects that impact a very small population

— GRANT REPORTS —

Reports help the Foundation track the progress of programs and projects and ensure proper oversight of grants awarded.

The report should be submitted with your application for the following grant cycle.

The Foundation will not release grant payment for future grants until all report requirements are complete. Please do not use this report for future support requests.

Grant Reporting Forms are available via Submittable. The reports are due 6 months after the grant is awarded. Please contact SPCF if you would like to submit a report 12 months after the grant is awarded due to program scheduling, other circumstances, etc.
